The front has been remodeled and presents a very pleasing and inviting appearance. It is well lighted and is in fact the most up-to-date theater front in the city. The floor has been lowered, giving the place the greatly desired incline floor with the entrance on the level with the front of the theater. The screen has been enlarged and the lighting system is something new in this section of the state. The place will be lighted during the entertainment as well as between acts with a lighting system designed by Mr. Cory, who owns and operates the place and is something new for a place of this kind.

This theater has always enjoyed a good patronage from Petoskey people as well as from the summer visitors and on Saturday entertained with "Cinderella," three whole reels being required for this subject.
