PETOSKEY STEAM LAUNDRY

New Institution to be Ready for Operation by February First.

The new steam laundry which has been under construction by W. L. McManus, Jr. on Mitchell street, just east of the postoffice, is now practically completed and the machinery is all installed, and excepting a few steam connections, is ready for operation. The building is 40x76 feet in size and is two stories in height and is built of good quality of brick. The first story is to be used by the laundry and the second floor for rooms for the help of the Cushman House in summer. The engine and boiler room is in the rear of the main building and separated from it by a heavy brick wall.

The laundry is equipped with all the latest laundry machinery, including new type brass turban washers, mechanical dry rooms and steam pressing machines. The five ton mangle, used for several months in the Cushman House laundry has been moved to the new steam laundry. This is the largest mangle in any laundry north of Grand Rapids. The engine room is equipped with a 50 h. p. automatic engine and the boiler room with a new 60 h. p. boiler. This boiler will also be used in heating the Cushman House. A water softening and filtering system is being installed and the place will use the city water but will use no chemicals

The new laundry is planning to make a specialty of family flat work, especially in the winter months, when housewives find the washing and the hanging out of the clothes a very disagreeable and too often a very cold job. Flat work washings will be taken as low as twenty-five cents. Present plans are to open the laundry about February first, but the work may progress rapidly enough to warrant its being opened before that date. The place will be known as the Petoskey Steam Laundry, and has been leased by Robert L. Wolff, for a number of years connected with the New Era Laundry.
